### *Christopher Columbus Was Wrong?*

With tomorrow being Columbus Day, what if you suddenly read in the papers that, “Christopher Columbus was wrong?” Now, think of the many things that Columbus is credited with. I am not saying that in any of those things he was wrong. But what about his use of God simply for his own benefit? The following is a devotion found in an old issue of Our Daily Bread:

*On one of Christopher Columbus’ voyages, he found that his crew’s food supply was almost depleted. Anchored off the island of Jamaica, he was grateful to be given food by the islanders. But as time went on, the gifts of food decreased so that the crew began to starve.*

*Columbus knew from an astronomy book that a lunar eclipse would soon occur. He called the native chiefs together and told them God was angry about their selfishness and would blot out the moon. At first the islanders scoffed. But when they watched the night’s silver disc slowly become dark, they became terrified and quickly brought food. Columbus said that if he prayed, the moon would be restored. Though we may empathize with his circumstances, Columbus’ “message from God” was dishonest and self-serving.*

Paul was aware that some were using God’s word for their own desires, and so in II Corinthians 2:17 he says, “**Unlike so many, we do not peddle the word of God for profit...**” We must realize that at all times we must be on guard not to misrepresent God’s message just to suit our own desires. You see, the purpose of sharing God’s word and His truths with those around us is to profit others, not to prosper ourselves. So be very careful the next time you are tempted to twist God’s word so that it fits into what you want.
